1. Introductions and Welcome

The meeting was called to order at 3:07 pm by CM Sullivan. Everyone introduced themselves and quorum was established.

5. Public Comment

6. HCAP Report -Stephen Spano

- Stephen Spano reviews the HCAP report.
 - Spano reviews a client case where the client has a significant level of disability but within their acuity scale, they lack the diagnoses that allows for intensive case management (ICM).
 - This case is an example of an increasing need of ICM in the HIV care system as PLWH continue to age.
 - Spano reviews a successful case where a client is signing a lease in a building that is a better living situation. Spano notes this was a long process, but success has finally been achieved.
 - Spano reviews housing services for a client that is in a hospice care facility for a transitional period. This client is capable of living independently but requires an ADA compliant unit. A unit was found through the support of ALRP.
 - Spano notes the challenge of ensuring the new unit is safe could require the client to experience danger or discomfort in order to be able to identify an issue.
 - Maria Lacayo asks for clarification around funding advocacy.
 - Spano answers that in this years budget proposal that HAN and HAPN are advocating with the Mayors budget and asks for \$500,000 for ICM services

7. Needs Assessment Draft Presentation

CS Perez reviews Needs Assessment 2022: Trans Folks living with HIV.

- Recommendations that come from the Needs Assessment are, Trans-specific cultural competency
 trainings needed for service providers, COE/Wrap around services for multiple needs to better supports
 trans folks, and targeted recruitment of trans service providers to better reflect the community being
 served.
- CM Thomas clarifies that HAPs contracts that use RW funds are able to provide technical assistance and trainings for trans healthcare. The transgender COE at UCSF do trainings as well.
- CM Sullivan comments on the aspect of discrimination that was being expressed and that more support is needed for the community. Reminding the group of the lack of care and cultural competency from doctors at the beginning of the AIDs epidemic.
- CS Molnar asks for this topic of trainings for trans issues to continue to stay on the agenda for the future.

• CS Molnar updates the group on the COLA targets, folks facing eviction, Latino/a/x, Black PLWH, and youth.
