Minutes

1. Call Meeting to Order and Roll Call. Introduction of Public. Co-Chair Welcome.

The meeting was called to order at 4:06 pm by CM Sullivan. Roll Call was called, everyone introduced themselves and quorum was established.

2. Review and Approve June 23rd, 2025, DRAFT Agenda – VOTE

The June 23rd, 2025 DRAFT Agenda was reviewed and approved by consensus.

3. Review and Approve May 19th, 2025, DRAFT Minutes – VOTE

The May 19th, 2025 DRAFT Minutes were reviewed and approved by consensus.

4. Announcements

CM Thomas provides an update on the State HIV budget, highlighting advocacy efforts around
making sure the ADAP rebate loans that were borrowed are paid back to mitigate any potential CDC
cuts. She notes the CDC HIV Prevention contract started on June 1st, 2025, but no one has received
notice of funds yet. She adds that, previously, Governor Newsom had proposed cuts to the
California Overdose Prevention and Harm Reduction Initiative (COPHRI) and the Legislature opposed
those cuts, so she is fairly confident those cuts won't be happening.

7. Membership Update – VOTE

- CS Molnar notes there is a motion on the floor from the Membership Committee to approve Leroy Blea. He would fill the appointed State Office of AIDS/Part B seat.
 - The potential new member, Leroy, introduces themself to the group.
 - o The group then votes on whether to approve Leroy's application.

Motion to accept Leroy Blea's new member application was approved through consensus, refer to column (3).

8. General Updates

- CAEAR Coalition CM Jewell
 - o There are no CAEAR Coalition updates this month.
- HHS CM Blum
 - o There are no HHS updates this month.
- CHEP & CPG CM Knoble
 - o There are no CHEP & CPG updates this month.
- GTZ CM Chevalier

- ETE Update CM Sullivan
 - CM Sullivan updates the group that the SF Onboard Summit happened on May 20th, 2025 and was very successful. He notes the ETE Steering Committee meeting was a debrief of the Summit and the consensus was that they would like to do the Summit yearly. CM Sullivan highlights that they received a lot of positive feedback, there were lots of young folks at the Summit, the panel discussions and breakout rooms went well. CM Sullivan highlights the efforts of folks who helped make the Summit possible.
- ADAP Update Nikki Gracey
 - o There are no ADAP updates this month.

9. Carry Forward Allocation – VOTE

- CS Molnar provides a brief overview of the annual Carry Forward Funding process, where unspent
 Federal funds from Ryan White Part A (RWPA) contracts can be reused within the same year. HHS
 collaborates with contract providers to determine the best use of these funds before presenting
 recommendations to the HCPC, which the submits them for Federal approval. CS Molnar reviews
 the service categories HHS is recommending the Carry Forwards Funds be used for:
 - Food/Home Delivered Meals \$288,122
 - Emergency Financial Assistance \$190,000
 - Other Professional Services \$25,000
 - ❖ Psychosocial Support \$15,000
- CS Molnar notes there is a motion on the floor from the Membership Committee to approve the Carry Forward Allocation.

The motion passes through roll call vote, refer to column (4).

11. Housing Update

• CM Vasquez shares the HIV Housing Programs overseen by the Mayor's Office of Housing and Community Development (MOHCD) in San Francisco. He reviews the eligibility requirements, which include income limits, proof of HIV status, and San Francisco residency. He shares the fiscal year 2025-2026 HIV Housing grant awards, noting the funding is a blend of Housing Opportunities for Persons with AIDS (HOPWA) and San Francisco General Funds. CM Vasquez reviews the referral process for clients and the documentation clients will need to provide. The presentation covered available housing options, such as permanent and transitional housing, tenant-based rental

subsidies and supportive services, and care facilities for people living with HIV/AIDS (PLWHA). CM Vasquez highlights the Plus Housing waitlist for eligible residents needing rental assistance or subsidized units, and shares details about new units being developed specifically for PLWHA. He also reviews the referral and application processes for Residential Care Facilities for the Chronically III (RCFCI) and Transitional Residential Care Facilities (TRCF), noting key differences between the programs. To reinforce understanding, CM Vasquez incorporates an interactive component where participants engage in a case study exercise and group discussion.

- CM Sullivan says he has seen Mayor Lurie on TV opening new housing and new high-rises, and asks if any of these are for our people—such as those that are chronically unhoused, disabled, people living with HIV (PLWH)?
 - CM Vasquez says yes, noting people may have seen the affordable housing units that are under construction at 1515 S. Van Ness, which should start leasing in 2027. He highlights that there are 9 sites being built that are part of affordable housing, and they got a deal that at each of these sites would have a dedicated number of 5 units that are designated for PLWH.
- CM Oskarsson asks if these units have been approved to crack ground or need to go through a process first?
 - CM Vasquez says essentially whenever a site is being looked at to be developed, the developers have to apply for housing loan funding through the State board before it's awarded.
- CM Sullivan notes that the City's General Funds provide more funding that HOPWA and asks if HOPWA is exhaustible?
 - CM Vasquez discusses HOPWA as a funding stream, noting that every jurisdiction is different.
 - CM Thomas says they used to fund housing with Ryan White Part A (RWPA) dollars until HRSA changed the regulations to allow for housing people on RWPA for two years. She mentions the trade that was done with RWPA dollars and General Funds dollars.
