### **HHS Administrative Updates**

• Funding

HHS received a Notification of Award for RWPA on 05/23/24 In the amount of \$14,985,007 for FY24/25.

This is a **\$228,370 decrease** from the FY23/24 which was **\$15,186,377.**

#### • HRSA/HAB Site Visit

## RWPA site visit is scheduled for and confirmed for 8/6/24 – 8/9/24.

HRSA-HAB is scheduled to meet with HCPC leadership and HCPC Support Staff during the site visit.

• HHS submitted application for RWPC for FY 25/26 on 06/17/24 for the maximum allowable amount of \$278,080.

FY 23/24 award was \$293,137.

## • CA State Office of AIDS HIV Care Connect (HCC)

# The ARIES successor system HCC go-live scheduled for 05/06/24 has been postponed.

SOA has not officially given a new date, but they have indicated that the new target go-live date will be in approximately 1-2 months.

HHS and contract agencies will continue to use ARIES in the interim.

HHS does not expect any negative effects for agencies or clients.

#### • Updating HHS Standards of Care (SOC) for SF Ryan White Funding

**Standards of Care jointly developed and reviewed by the recipient (HHS) and the local planning body (HCPC)** are a legislative requirement of Ryan White Programs for each EMA funded service category to ensure good standards and service are clearly defined.

HHS and consultant Robert Whirry are consulting with subject matter experts, reviewing and making draft edits to existing SOC and developing new SOC for review and approval by HCPC Steering and then full HCPC.

Goal is to complete review of all SOC by 06/24/24 HCPC Meeting. For the June 2024 HCPC meeting the following SOC will be reviewed for approval: Outpatient Ambulatory Health Services, Mental Health Services, Food Services, Outreach, Hospice Services, and Emergency Financial Assistance.

#### **DPH Budget**

- Ambulatory Care Executive Leadership recently informed that sections including HHS will not be asked to provide a 5% contingency reduction for general fund direct client services.
- Mayor London Breed announced she is planning to backfill cuts to San Francisco portion of RWPA federal grant for FY24/25

SFDPH CHEP and HHS Plan for Integrated Plan and Blueprint Development and Implementation

• Facente Consulting is currently developing a tracking and reporting tool for SF DPH.

HIV and Aging -City and County of San Francisco (CCSF) Cross Agency Collaboration

 HHS, Mayors Office of Housing and Community Development (MOHCD) and Disability and Aging Services (DAS) Office of Community Partnerships held a third meeting on 6/18/24 to continue to explore opportunities for collaboration across programs to better serve HIV+ Elders and HIV+ People with Disabilities. Areas identified for collaboration include: Cross Training line staff training among CCSF Departments

DAS will be providing an orientation training for HHS service providers on 7/16/24. Supporting increased DAS connection to HIV stakeholder community Soliciting structured feedback from Subject Matter experts (SME) and Research of HIV and Aging Initiatives outside of SF

## **HHS CQI**

HHS CQI Group holds quarterly meetings to support contract agencies to continue to improve viral load suppression level for all patients within the RWP and SF GF population.

HHS CQI also focuses eliminating viral load suppression rate disparities for subpopulations that fall below the average for all patients.

HHS CQI group has focused on eliminating disparities in viral load suppression in Black/African American population over the past several years and has successfully statistically eliminated this disparity for clients in care for the programs participating in this initiative.

The Black/African American population remains a **"watch metric"** to ensure that a disparity in viral load suppression does not re-emerge.

HHS CQI group has begun to focus on eliminating the disparity in viral load suppression for people experiencing housing instability and homelessness with a goal of first reducing and then eliminating this disparity.

HHS has expanded to include consumer representation at the upcoming meeting scheduled for July 11, 2024.
