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What is ARIES? What is it used for?

- ARIES (AIDS Regional Information Evaluation System) data is used for:
 - evaluation of quality indicators of health and coordinated QI activities
 - measurement of certain program performance objectives
 - data pulled for Ryan White grant application and annual federal reporting

Facts on the Data reporting

Reporting Period: 1/1/2023-12/31/2023


Funding Source: Ryan White Part A,B,C,D and SFDPH HHS General Funds, and EHE funds

Date of Data: Information is solely based on the data in ARIES as of June 17, 2024 and is **not reflective of** all epidemiological data from EMA.

Total EMA Unduplicated Client Count (UDC):

N = 6,367 (clients received a service in ARIES under the above funding sources)

Notes on the Data (1 of 2)

Many data elements responses are based upon client self-report.

Medical data is based on actual medical records/lab results.

"New" in ARIES refers to clients receiving HHS Ryan White/GF/EHE services in the new contract fiscal year not necessarily "newly" diagnosed.

Notes on the Data (2 of 2)

"Unknown" is a value selected by the ARIES user, which means there was an attempt to collect the data but the client was unable to provide it.

Unknown may also mean user did not ask or select any option and data element was left blank.

Unknown #/%'s will be stated but removed from graphs/pie charts for comparative analysis.

EMA Total UDC Breakouts

EMA-Wide – The Unduplicated Client (UDC) is 6,367

- 517 or 8.12% of clients served in the EMA were "new" in ARIES
- or 1.01% are shared clients across counties within the EMA.

Marin County – UDC is 261 or 4% of total EMA UDC

• 19 or 7.28 % clients served in Marin were "new" in ARIES

San Francisco County – UDC is 5,658 or 88.8% of total EMA UDC

 462 or 8.17% clients served in San Francisco were "new" in ARIES


San Mateo County – UDC is 563 or 8.8% of total EMA UDC

• 73 or 12.97% clients served in San Mateo were "new" in ARIES






EMA by Current Gender 2013-2023














Insurance Status for EMA






EMA ART By Race*





EMA ART by Age*





EMA ART by Gender*





EMA Viral Load by Age*



FAQ'S

Is this data reflecting everyone who is living with HIV in SF, Marin and San Mateo?

A: No, this data is only reflecting clients that receive services through Ryan White, EHE, and General Fund HHS funding.

Why is the ART and viral load only based on the clients that received primary care?

A: ARIES requires primary care providers to enter viral load from a verified lab for their clients. Other providers who do not have access to a client's labs can't enter this data. Similarly, medical providers also collect ART information on all their clients.

Why do the insurance percentages add up to more than 100%?

A: The reason this data field does not equal to 100% is because clients can report more than one type of insurance during the reporting period.

HIV Care Connect

When will HIV Care Connect go live?

The new system is currently pushed back and we have no given date at the moment.

Why was go-live postponed?

CDPH Office of AIDS has decided to postpone the go-live date for HIV Care Connect (HCC) based on requests from service providers to accommodate the following factors:

Start using HCC after completing the 2023 Ryan White HIV/AIDS Program Services Report (RSR) report in ARIES to avoid disruptions to the reporting process.

Accommodate HCC Import functionality changes and allow providers to setup their internal systems to meet HCC Import requirements before go-live.

Additional bugs were discovered, and another round of User Acceptance Testing (UAT) was needed.

HIV Care Connect

What is different about HIV Care Connect?

HCC will provide a modern user interface with more intuitive screens and easier navigation. HCC will be web-based and no digital certificates will be necessary. Users will have access to selected ADAP and lab data to help coordinate care. EMR (electronic medical record) data upload will be simpler to reduce duplicate entry.

Will the clients and services data be available in HCC?

Yes, data for clients in ARIES who have received services from January 1, 2017 to the present will be available in the new system.

Will HCC have reporting capabilities?

Yes, HCC will have reporting capabilities including aggregate reports and client detail reports.

HIV Care Connect

What training opportunities will there be for HIV Care Connect?

The State Office of AIDS will handle the initial trainings for HCC. All current end users that are actively using ARIES since 2024, will be offered an opportunity to be trained. It is possible that HHS will offer additional trainings for UOS entry and reports training.
