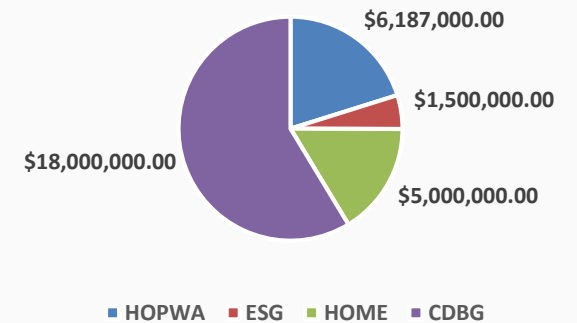

What is the 5-Year Plan?

- Supplement to the City's Five-Year Consolidated Plan submitted every 5 years to the US Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD)
- HUD dedicated funding for housing for PLWHA is Housing Opportunities for People with AIDS (HOPWA)

What is the 5-Year Plan?

- Document progress
- Identify evolving challenges
- Articulate goals and strategies to improve long-term housing outcomes for PLWHA

- Vouchers – Amounts, Quantity
- Housing Stability Supports/Access to Supportive Services
- Increasing Independence – Vocational Training, Removing disincentives for work

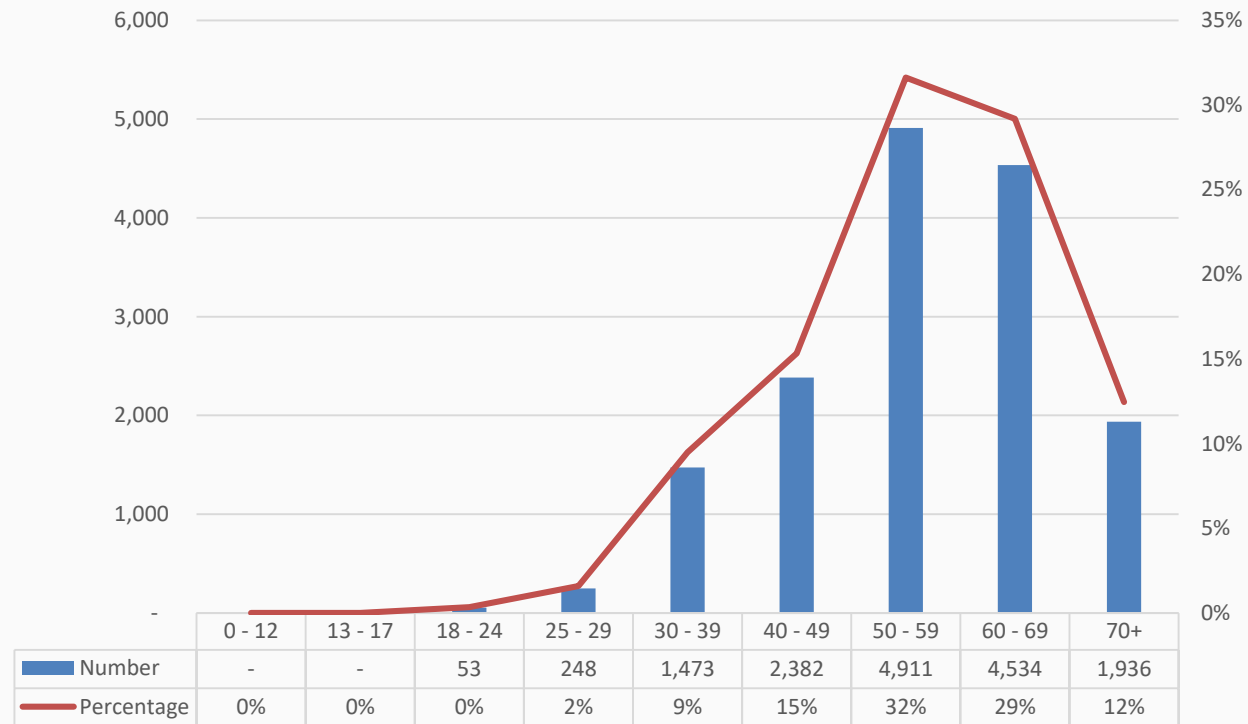

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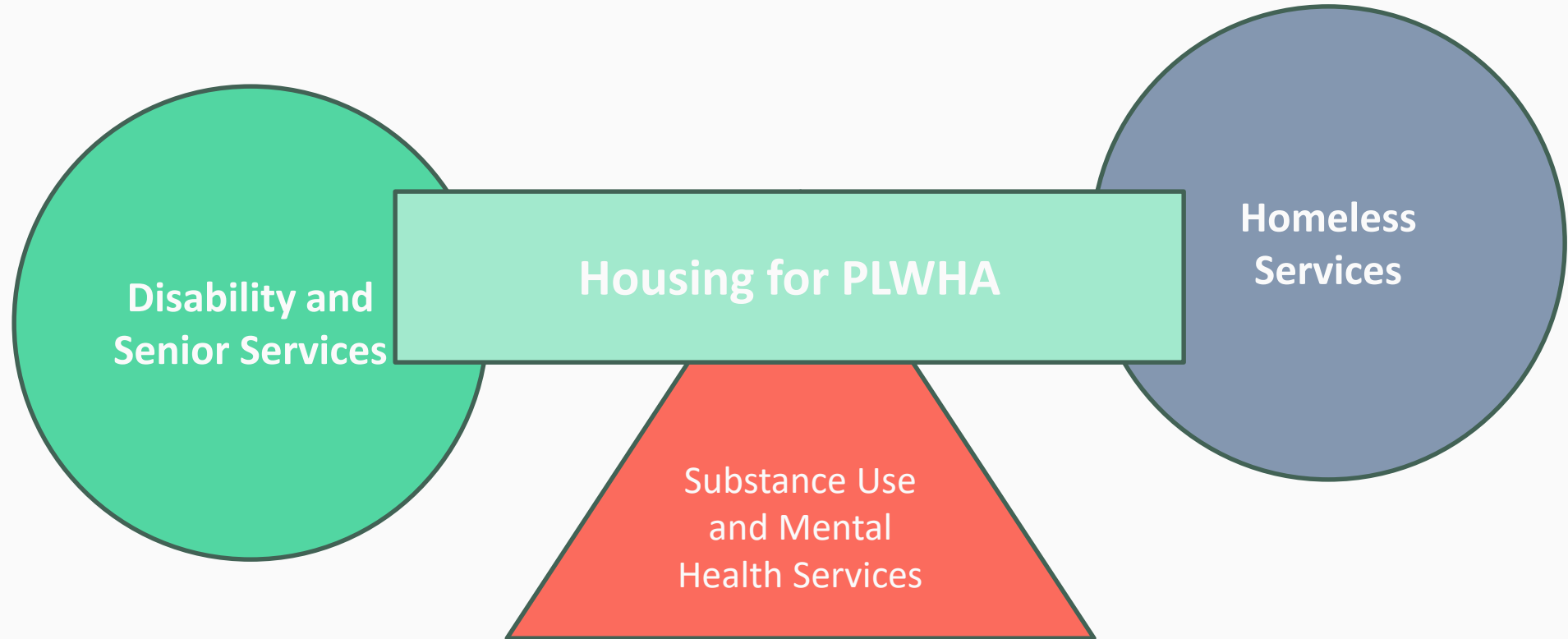

CalAIM Enhanced Care Management (ECM) Populations of Focus

- 1. Individuals Experiencing Homelessness*
- 2. Individuals At Risk for Avoidable Hospital or ED Utilization (Formerly “High Utilizers”)*
- 3. Individuals with Serious Mental Health and/or SUD Needs*
- 4. Individuals Transitioning from Incarceration*
- 5. Adults Living in the Community and At Risk for LTC Institutionalization*

Key Theme: New Funding Stream - CalAIM

CalAIM Community Supports

1. Housing Transition Navigation Services
2. Housing Deposits
3. Housing Tenancy and Sustaining Services
4. Short-Term Post-Hospitalization Housing
5. Recuperative Care (Medical Respite)
6. Respite Services
7. Day Habilitation Programs
8. Nursing Facility Transition/Diversion to Assisted Living Facilities, such as Residential Care Facilities for the Elderly (RCFE) and Adult Residential Facilities (ARF)
9. Community Transition Services/Nursing Facility Transition to a Home
10. Personal Care and Homemaker Services
11. Environmental Accessibility Adaptations (Home Modifications)
12. Medically-Supportive Food/Meals/Medically Tailored Meals
13. Sobering Centers
14. Asthma Remediation

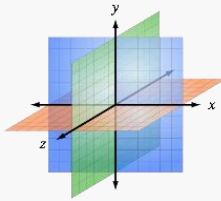
