Food / Home Delivered Meals	Expanded food services for HIV-positive clients. Provision of services includes prepared meals, groceries, and nutrition education under the supervision of a Registered Dietitian; also, food solicitation and a food bank for agencies that feed their HIV clients. Services can include congregate meals and nutritional counseling.	\$288, 122 (55%)
Emergency Financial Assistance	Provide emergency financial assistance grants, invoiced in UOS of \$100.00. The financial assistance payments are issued to third party providers (credit report companies, housing search companies, utilities, and medical services). A portion of these funds is set aside as available for expenses incurred by long-term survivors associated with senior-related living expenses	\$190,000 (37%)
Other Professional Services	Support for additional Legal Services Interns to support client case research and client interviews to better address emerging legal needs. This is proposed in part due to the on-going housing crisis in San Francisco and potential complications as we emerge from eviction moratoriums.	\$25, 000 (5%)
Psychosocial Support	Support to provide an event for long-term survivors of HIV and providers of services to this population to come together to share their stories and to honor their resilience amid significant adversity and profound loss. A provider will organize a 2-day town hall that will afford participants the opportunity to speak to the challenges of being a long-term survivor in the SF EMA. A report summarizing findings and recommendations from the town hall will be available within the year.	\$15,000 (3%)
